I have almost 25 years of experience in working with coffee in Latin America, Africa and Asia, of which 12 years in Rainforest Alliance.

At the beginning of my career I worked with the FAO in sustainable coffee projects in Costa Rica and Honduras, which provided me with the "on the ground experience" as excellent basis to understand the reality of coffee procurers. At Rainforest Alliance I started to manage a range of coffee projects in Latin America, Asia and Africa, focused at the development of Rainforest Alliance Certified coffee supply at origin, strengthening the sustainability of certified farms and creating impact on and beyond certified lands, in coffee communities and landscapes.

In my current role, as Sector Lead Coffee for Rainforest Alliance I provide strategic direction to Rainforest Alliance's coffee work globally, with the objective to positively contribute to the transformation of the sector, the livelihoods of coffee producers and workers and the environment that surrounds them.

From 2012 through 2020 I was member of the Technical Committee of GCP and former 4C, this experience enabled me to get a deep understanding of GCP's work, to support them in the development of their technical orientation as a key entry point for positioning themselves as the lead platform of the coffee industry.

Working together and achieving strategic alignment, as two mayor sustainability stakeholders in the coffee industry, enables us to create synergies and in that way increase the impact both organizations envision. Having the opportunity of participating on the GCP board, with strengthen our alignment even further

- 1) As Rainforest Alliance we are very much interested to support GCP in their efforts of achieving more transparency with regard to the public available data in the coffee industry, which we consider a key effort to continue to trigger increased demand for sustainable coffee. As such we are very honored to continue to play a role in the TC, where the foundations are laid for the sustainability reporting through the equivalence mechanism.
- 2) We are interested to explore collaboration around the topic if Living Income (LI) in the context of the ICO taskforce, addressing LI which is high on the agenda of both organizations.
- 3) Deepen our collaboration and collective impact on the ground, through the coffee platform and the collective action.
