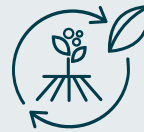




Partnerships for Forests (P4F) is a UK Aid-funded programme that aims to catalyse investment into the forestry sector. P4F has partnered with Global Coffee Platform (GCP) to enhance the enabling environment and promote the adoption of sustainable practices throughout the coffee value chain. Additionally, the partnership aims to strengthen GCP-affiliated multi-stakeholder platforms.

Project theory of change

Country platforms

The GCP-affiliated Country Platforms provide a neutral, multi-stakeholder forum for the coffee sector to collaboratively discuss common challenges and approaches to scaling the sustainable production of coffee. The P4F and GCP partnership supports Country Platforms in Kenya, Uganda and Tanzania.



National Sustainability Curricula

The Country Platforms oversee the development and roll-out of a National Sustainability Curricula (NSC). This includes guidelines of Good Agricultural and Sustainability Practices and related resources utilised by national, regional, or sectoral extension services to support coffee farmers.

A few Country Platforms have launched Collective Action Initiatives (including in Uganda) aimed to address country-specific sustainability gaps identified in the NSC or Country Strategy, via pre-competitive and sector wide collaboration.



Knowledge and learning sessions

The lessons from this project have been shared with the broader network of 10 Country Platforms supported by GCP across the tropical belt. By combining P4F's expertise in sustainable land use approaches with GCP's network of Country Platforms and their expertise as the leading multi-stakeholder forum for the coffee sector, this has created an environment that is conducive to allowing farmers to achieve sustainable and prosperous livelihoods.
